Measuring Guide

Height:

From the top of the head to the floor (without shoes) is the height. Most people know their height. The height measurement usually determines the variation.

Variation Height Range

Short	5'8" or less
Regular	5'9" - 5'11"
Long	6' - 6'2"
Extra Long	6'3" and over



Chest:

This measurement is taken around the chest. Place the tape line well up under the arms, straight across the back, over the blades and over the chest in the front. This measurement usually determines the coat size. The normal difference between the chest measurement and the waist measurement is six inches. If a customer's chest measurement is 42, the customer's waist should be approximately 36.



Overarm:

This measurement is taken around the body in same manner and position where the chest was measured, but this time over both arms. The normal difference between the overarm measurement and the chest is six inches. If a customer's overarm measurement is 48, the customer's coat size should be approximately 42.



Waist:

This measurement is taken with coat off. Place the tape measure directly over the shirt, just above the hip bones and through the naval. The normal difference between the waist measurement and the chest measurement is six inches. If a customer's waist measurement is 36, the customer's coat size should be approximately 42.



Hips:

This measurement is taken with the coat off. Place the tape line directly over the pants around the largest part of the seat. Before taking this measurement see that the customer removes all bulky articles from his hip pockets and has heels together, when fitting slacks. The normal difference between the hip measurement and the chest measurement is six inches. If a customer's hip measurement is 48, the customer's coat size should be approximately 42.



Outseam:

Ask the customer to place his pants on his waist where he is comfortable (usually higher than they were before you asked). Take the tape and from the top of his pant line measure to the floor. Subtract 1" and this will be the pant outseam measurement.



Neck:

Measure with collar unbuttoned. Place the tape around the neck, and measure at the level of the collar, add 1/2" for comfort. This measurement is taken for shirt neck size.



Sleeve Length:

Forearm should be held at a right angle with the upperarm about twelve inches from the chest. Place the end of the tape at base of neck at the center of the back and measure to shoulder and then around elbow. Leaving the arm in the same position, continue measuring to the wrist joint. The measurement at the wrist joint is the shirt sleeve length.



Coat Sleeve

Variation	Total Sleeve	Inseam
Short	31" - 32"	16" - 16 1/2"
Regular	33" - 34"	17" - 17 1/2"
Long	35" - 36"	18" - 18 1/2"
Extra Long	37" and over	19" - 19 1/2"
